Introduction

The geographical boundaries of service included in the scope of Trinity's Local Missions Ministry are defined by, and aligned with, the Presbytery of Western North Carolina.

Endowments and other gifts sometimes allow our team to allocate more than the budgeted amount to named or voted-upon agencies.

Covid interrupted nearly all volunteer "jobs," for guite a while, but Trinity members persevered wherever possible.
